



Exclusion Periods

| Medication / Ailment | Exclusion Period |
|----------------------|--|
| Chicken Pox | 5 days from diagnosis or until spots have dried, whichever is longer |
| Conjunctivitis | Until eye discharge stops or treatment begins |
| Diarrhoea | 48 hours after the last episode of diarrhoea |
| Scarlet Fever | Until 24 hours after commencing appropriate antibiotic treatment |
| Headlice | As soon as treatment begins |
| Impetigo | Until all lesions have crusted over, or 48 hours after commencing appropriate antibiotic treatment |
| Medication | 24 hours after the first dose of a new medication |
| Vaccinations | No exclusion period unless combined with other symptoms requiring exclusion |
| Vomiting | 48 hours after the last episode of vomiting |
| Other | Please enquire for guidance |

HOW IT WORKS

Our exclusion periods are generally based on governmental guidelines, available on the www.gov.uk website. However, we may enforce stricter exclusion periods if we determine there is a significant risk to the health and well-being of other children, staff, or families.
